PLANNING REVIEWS COMPLETED FOR OCTOBER PC MEETING 2024:

NO PLANNING MEETING WAS HELD AS ALL PROJECTS LISTED BELOW WERE TABLED BY THE APPLICANT, THEREFORE NO ACTION WAS TAKEN ON ANY PLANS.

Docket #2356 – Parkland Circle, 6045 Reppert Lane, Preliminary Land Development –the applicant is proposing the construction of 25 townhome units at 6045 Reppert Lane. The project is located within the Township's R5 – Medium High Density Residential Zoning District.

Docket #2355 – TransEdge Truck Centers, 5344 Tilghman Street, Final Land Development –The applicant is proposing to demolish the existing northern-most building and construct a new 33,075 square foot building in its place, along with dedicated tractor parking spaces and employee parking areas. The site is located within the Township's HC – Highway Commercial Zoning District.

Docket #2385 – Delta Solar Energy, 8945 & 9141 Main Street, Preliminary/Final Land Development – The applicant is proposing the construction of a solar panel array, driveway access, storage containers, and fencing on a former landfill site. The applicant is also proposing a lot line adjustment to allow a portion of the site to be retained for agricultural use. The properties are located within the Township's R1 – Rural Residential District.

GRANGE ROAD ROUNDABOUT:

Additional signage and identification markers have been added to the center island for increased visibility. As a reminder the recommended speed limit is 15 MPH and that the vehicle within the roundabout has the right of way with the approaching vehicle yielding to the internal traffic flow.

HAAF ROAD CLOSURE:

HAAF Road will be closed to thru traffic to allow improvements for the realignment of Haaf Road and the realignment of the intersection of Main street as part of the Glenlivet West Development. Please utilize the posted detour for access to Adams Road.

SALDO INTERIM UPDATES:

The SALDO has been updated to incorporate the Vision Zero Action plan recommendations as well as some definition updates, additional stormwater requirements, general updates to Preliminary and Final chapters, removal of the woodland conservation. A full rewrite will be completed upon completion of the Zoning Ordinance rewrite.
